Although I obviously don't have all the details, on face value I'm hesitant. A merger of two organizations should be mutually beneficial. If they are dwindling significantly, what do they bring to the table? The harsh but honest question is, is this a merger or a bailout? Are we potentially taking on more issues than we have the person-power, time, and/or desire to address? Do they have any strategic plans for recruitment and future endeavors? If not, would it be possible to disband their chapter and join MNSOPHE? Per our by-laws, individuals from surrounding states can join MNSOPHE if they do not have a local chapter.

I think its certainly something that can be further explored but again, on face value I have concerns. My two cents. I assume this would need to go to a vote for all members?
